Miller said: "...a lot of people give a lot of their lives to a company or even the government, and when they are no longer needed, when they are used up, they're tossed aside...Willie Loman's situation is even more common now than it was then [1949]. A lot of people are

eliminated earlier from the productive life in this society than they used to be" (Mays, 2010, p. 1736). Willie represents the one who tried to fulfill this dream to be a salesman and failed being "eliminated from productive life". Even being old and having wife Linda and two adult sons Biff and Happy, Willie willfully continues going against himself.
