And so as he grew up among the streets of Paddington and Notting Hill and when he visited his family in Ireland he felt a tension between the notions of home, nation and belonging. *Going to My Father's House* charts the historian's attempt

to make sense of these ties and to see how they manifest in a globalised world. He explores the places - the house, the street, the walls and the graves - that formed his own identity. He asks what place the ideas of history, heritage and nostalgia have in creating a sense of ourselves. He concludes with a plea for a history that holds the past to account but also allows for dynamic, inclusive change.
